Minnesota Basket Weavers Guild - Class Registration Form November 20, 2021 Harvesting and Weaving With MN Forged Fibers Guest Instructor – Mercedes Tuma-Hansen

Nature provides many wonderful fibers. This course is an opportunity to play with a variety of plants that grow right here in Minnesota and that people have been using for hundreds of years to make rope and string. Dogbane, cattails, basswood trees, and flax plants all have long, strong fibers in them that have many uses. The Ojibwe of northern Minnesota used basswood bark to sew and tie their world together without metal nails. And Scandinavian fishermen used natural fibers to weave their nets. In this course you will learn about the process of harvesting and processing wild fiber plants, and you will get to play with twisting the plant fibers into twine. As a fun way to create a finished product from your twining samples, you will fashion your different pieces of cordage into a bookmark, bracelet, necklace, or other small item of your own imagination! It is fun to feel and compare each plant and discover the product of your work. You will come away with your samples of twine and the knowledge about plant fibers.

Required materials for students to provide:

Beads with larder holes, ribbons, buttons, yarn or fabric scraps to incorporate into your projects. Scissors, glue (any kind).



Instructor Bio:

Mercedes is a history educator in the Twin Cities area where she enjoys teaching American Indian and environmental education programs at schools, senior centers and nature parks. During the pandemic she has adapted to online teaching. Learning to teach as a tour guide at the Minnesota Historical Society, Mercedes won a national award for developing a museum education program there. By teaching historic traditions like net making, and pioneer and foraging skills, and making traditional art with a modern twist, Mercedes continues to pursue her passion for connecting the past to our modern lives. She and her husband and toddler have recently embarked on a farm adventure with chickens and cats, and have begun planting nut and maple trees.
